Group Management Report

for the three-month period from 1 October 2014 to 31 December 2014

Overview

Market Development

The global economic expansion accelerated in the course of 2014. Gross domestic product picked up perceptibly in the third quarter following an only moderate increase in the first six months of the calendar year. The Institute for the World Economy signals a consistently high level of global growth in production activity for the quarter from October to December 2014. However, compared to the medium-term trend, the growth rate continues to be moderate. At an annual average growth rate of 3.4 %, global production probably has not grown much faster than in 2013.

Course of Business

The Hönle Group's business development in the first quarter of the 2014/2015 financial year was positive. Sales revenues generated by the Hönle Group rose from T€ 20,254 in the previous financial year to T€ 21,790 in the current financial year.

The operating result (EBIT) came to T€ 2,653, which corresponds to a 19.6 % increase compared to the previous year.

Segment Equipment & Systems

Sales in the Equipment & Systems segment climbed by 4.1 % to T€ 11,382. By contrast, the operating result was down T€ 1,025 from the previous year's value of T€ 1,167 due to a higher cost of materials ratio at Dr. Hönle AG which is attributable to the implemented product mix.

Eltosch Grafix GmbH reported stable development despite manroland sheetfed GmbH's announcement that short-time work would be introduced from the beginning of 2015. In the first quarter, the operating result was slightly above the prior year's level. The orders portfolio at the end of the reporting period was significantly higher than in the prior-year period, by contrast, which signals a positive course of business in the powder sprayer and infrared drying segments.

Eltosch Grafix GmbH moved to a new location in December 2014. The new representative company building is located in Pinneberg near Hamburg and enables implementation of the company's planned expansion.

The sales development at PrintConcept GmbH is largely driven by major projects in the web offset segment. Following a subdued start to the new financial year - similar to the previous year -, it is now expected that major projects will be realised in the second half of the year.

Segment Glass & Lamps

At T \in 4,115, sales revenues generated in the Glass & Lamps segment were almost unchanged in comparison with the previous year (T \in 4,188). The operating result improved from T \in -67 to T \in 19.

As scheduled, Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH was the only company that contributed with an operating result of T€ -280 negatively to the 'Glass and Lamps' segment in the first quarter also.

Several measures were initiated or already implemented with a view to improving earnings power.

Restructuring measures concerning the melting furnaces of Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH were carried out as planned. The measures relating to the melting furnaces in which products are manufactured for the lamp and automotive industries were successful as expected and the reject rates for these melting furnaces dropped significantly. At the same time, the company succeeded in substantially reducing energy costs due to new insulating material.

At present, the remaining melting furnaces in which products are manufactured for the semi-conductor and glass fibre industry are undergoing optimization processes with a view to achieving high quality quartz glass products from the third quarter on. In the course of the year, specifically in the second half of the year, increases in sales and earnings are expected to arise from the above-mentioned effects.

A new managing director with many years of experience in the lamp industry will contribute to further improving the high quality level of UV lamps and, at the same time, drop the reject rates. Moreover, the optimisation of production processes will also contribute to increasing the company's earnings power.

Segment Adhesives

The Adhesives segment reported encouraging development. The Hönle Group again sold more adhesives than in the prior-year period. While sales revenues climbed 22.7 % to T€ 6,294, the operating result was up 38.4 % to T€ 1,724. A perceptible rise in sales was largely accomplished due to new model cycles for smart phones.

Last year, Dr. Hönle AG acquired a company building in Torrington, Connecticut (USA) in order to prepare for the planned growth in the Adhesives segment on the American market. Tangent Industries Inc. moved into the new building and all required restructuring measures have been completed. The necessary preconditions for achieving the planned sales growth in the North American sales territory have thus been created.

Results of Operations

The Hönle Group's sales revenues amounted to $T \in 21,790$ in the first quarter of the 2014/2015 financial year, up 7.6 % from the sales revenues generated in the prior-year period ($T \in 20,254$).

Sales revenues generated in the Equipment & Systems business segment climbed from $T \in 10,937$ in the previous year to $T \in 11,382$ in the current financial year as a result of the stable development in the printing industry. Consequently, 52.2 % (PY: 54.0 %) of total sales were achieved in this business segment. Sales revenues achieved in the Adhesives segment rose from $T \in 5,129$ to $T \in 6,294$ in the first quarter due to the strong demand for industrial adhesives, particularly in the smart phones segment. Consequently, 28.9 % (PY: 25.3 %) of total sales were achieved in the Adhesives segment.

At T€ 4,115, sales revenues in the Glass & Lamps segment remained almost unchanged from the previous year's level (T€ 4,188), which corresponds to an 18.9 % share in total sales (PY: 20.7 %).

The Hönle Group's regional sales distribution is structured as follows: At T€ 7,820, domestic sales revenues were almost on par with the previous year's level (T€ 7,952). Hönle thus achieved 35.9 % (PY: 39.3 %) of its sales revenues in Germany. Sales revenues generated in Europe outside Germany increased from T€ 4,651 to T€ 5,054, which corresponds to 23.2 % (PY: 23.0 %) of total sales. Sales revenues generated in the first quarter were up on the previous year's values in Italy, in particu-

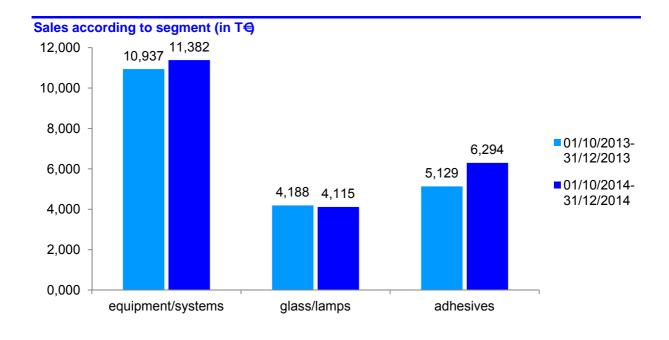
lar. In addition to positive development in Europe, growth impetus in the first quarter was mainly provided by the Asian economic area, however: Sales revenues achieved outside Europe improved from T€ 7,651 to T€ 8,916, which corresponds to 40.9 % (PY: 37.8 %) of total sales. This revenue growth is mainly attributable to China, Japan and Korea.

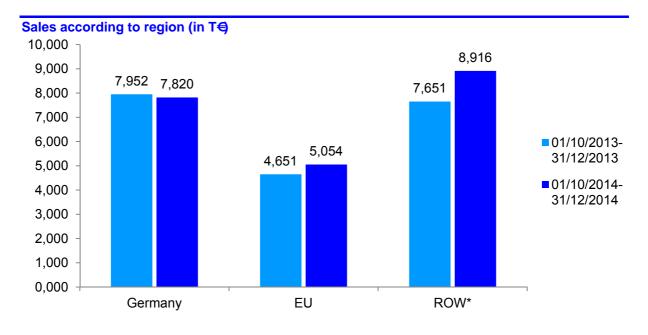
During the period from October to December 2014, the Hönle Group generated other operating income of T€ 448 (PY: T€ 262). This includes revenues in the amount of T€ 240 which resulted from the partial settlement of registered receivables from insolvent manroland AG. The receivables were already derecognised in financial year 2012/2013.

The Hönle Group's operating result (EBIT) improved from T€ 2,218 to T€ 2,653 in the first quarter of the current financial year. Earnings before tax (EBT) rose from T€ 2,097 to T€ 2,520, while the consolidated result increased from T€ 1,509 to T€ 1,801. This corresponds to earnings per share of € 0.32 (PY: € 0.28).

The profit ratios thus also improved when compared to the previous year: The EBIT margin picked up from 10.7 % to 12.6 %, while net profit on sales climbed from 7.5 % to 8.3 %. The cost of materials ratio dropped from 36.9 % to 35.3 %. At 33.8 %, the personnel expense ratio has remained almost unchanged from the previous year's level (PY: 33.9 %). The ratio of other operating expenses came to 17.3 %, which is slightly higher than in the previous year (16.8 %).

Financial Position

The T \in 1,537 increase in trade accounts receivable and the decrease in other liabilities of T \in 1,505 were mainly responsible for the decline in cash from current activities in the amount of T \in -330 (PY: T \in 1,390) in the first quarter of the current financial year.

The cash flow from investing activities amounted to T€ -342, down from the level of T€ -1,036 reported in the previous year. It includes, inter

alia, expenses incurred for technical equipment, business equipment and software licenses. The cash flow from financing activities in the amount of T€ 353 (PY: T€ -306) is due to borrowings from banks in the amount T€ 557 and the repayment of liabilities to shareholders in the amount T€ 204.

In all, liquid assets decreased by $T \in 1,036$ to $T \in 4,649$ during the first three months of the current financial year.

Net Assets

The Hönle Group's non-current and current assets came to T€ 85,867 as at 31 December 2014, which is on par with the previous year's level. Trade accounts receivable climbed from T€ 12,243 to T€ 13,758 in the first three months of the current financial year, while liquid assets declined from T€ 5,685 to T€ 4,649. With a capital ratio of 60.1 %, Hönle Group financing continues to be on very solid ground.

Both non-current and current liabilities saw a decrease in the first quarter of the financial year; non-current liabilities dropped by T€ 692 to T€ 15,984, while current liabilities fell by T€ 955 to T€ 18,246.

In the first quarter of the 2014/2015 financial year loans towards banks were repaid in the amount of ca. T€ 600. Bank loans in the amount of T€ 11.562 were held as at 31.12.2014.

Research and Development

The focus of R&D activities was on order-related development. Hönle Group's order-independent research and development expenses dropped from T€ 258 in the previous year to T€ 236 in the financial year under review. The number of staff employed in the Research and Development departments was 59 (PY: 60). Consequently, 11.3 % of the entire workforce is employed in research and development.

The Hönle Group developed several new products to market maturity or further enhanced existing products.

With the UVAHAND LED, Hönle launched a high-intensity hand-held UV lamp. The device is used in all applications requiring the reliable, homogeneous curing of UV-reactive adhesives and casting compounds. The main areas of use are the following: the joining of gas, plastics and metal as well as the manufacture of electrical and electronic components. The device is also used for particle control in clean rooms and authenticity or fluorescence testing for quality assurance purposes.

The Hönle Group participated in several trade fairs in Germany and abroad to engage in active dialogue with customers and other market participants. In this context, Hönle presented solutions and systems for curing and drying UV-reactive coatings, inks and adhesives. The number of adhesive applications constantly rising in the electronics industry, in particular.

Supplementary Report

Since 1 January 2015, no events of special significance have occurred that would impact significantly on Hönle Group's net assets, financial position and results of operations.

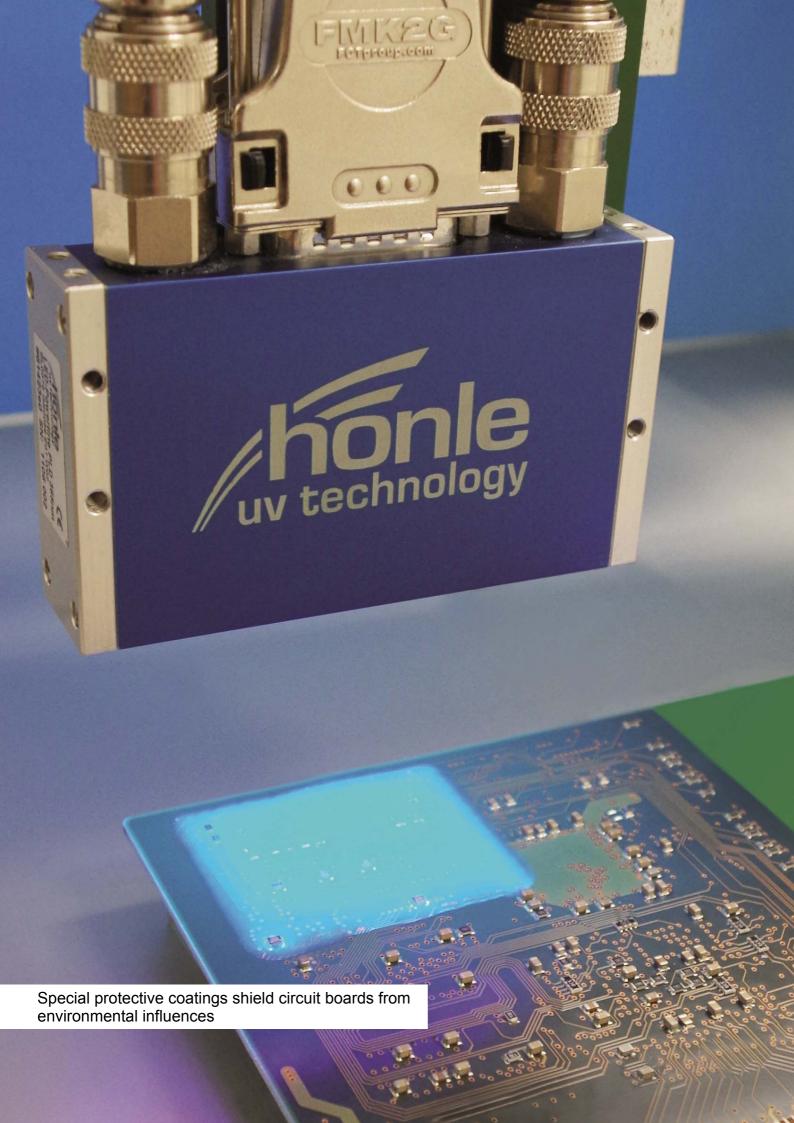

Personnel expenses amounted to T€ 7,099 in the first quarter, which is almost unchanged from the previous year's level.

Hönle invests in occupational training with a view to covering the future demand for qualified personnel: The Hönle Group offers vocational training in the segments: business administration, technology, chemistry and logistics. As at 31 December 2014, 16 young people received occupational training at the Hönle Group (19 as at 31 December 2013.



Outlook

Overall market

Worldwide economic growth is expected to gradually gain in momentum in the year 2015. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the Institute for the World Economy predict that global production will increase by 3.5 % or 3.7 %, respectively. The expansive monetary policy and low oil prices increasingly fall on fertile ground. Higher growth rates are on the horizon for the next two years in the advanced economies, in particular. The emerging markets are expected to benefit from stronger demand in the advanced economies. However, structural problems will prevent a swift return to higher expansion rates. In addition to the Asian economic area, the United States, with projected economic growth of 3.6 %, will be the main growth engine of the global economy in 2015.

Hönle Group

Positive sales and earnings development is expected for the Equipment & Systems segment. The forecast is supported by the orders on hand of Dr. Hönle AG and Eltosch Grafix GmbH and also by current projects which are likely to materialize in the next quarters. Moreover, PrintConcept GmbH and Mitronic GmbH will realize projects in the second half of the year that are reflected in the companies' sales and earnings development.

At T€ -280, Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH still contributed negatively to earnings reported for the Glass & Lamps segment in the first quarter of the year. Several measures were already introduced or taken in the previous year in order to improve the company's earnings power. Rebuilding measures concerning the melting furnaces of Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH, where products for the lamp and automotive industry are manufactured, were implemented according to plan. The scrap ratio for these melting furnaces dropped significantly as a result and the use of new insulating material led to a planned reduction of energy costs. At present, the melting furnaces for the manufacture of semi-conductor and glass fibre industry products are undergoing optimization processes and it is expected that the furnaces will be able to manufacture high quality products from the third quarter onwards. The aim is to generate sales growth in the course of the second half of the year and to achieve positive earnings contributions at Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH.

A new managing director with many years of experience in the segment of UV lamps will strengthen Aladin GmbH's management team in the future. He will make a significant contribution to further improving the already high quality level of UV lamps and to achieving a sustained increase in the company's earnings power. Aladin GmbH also assumes an increase in sales and earnings in the course of the current financial year.

UV-Technik Speziallampen GmbH aims at producing and offering infrared lamps for a broad-based range of customers in addition to meeting the internal demand of the Hönle Group. Short to medium term corporate growth is planned for in this product segment, in particular, but also in the area of lamps for ballast water treatment. Both the orders on hand and current projects indicate positive a business development for the current financial year.

The positive development in the Adhesives segment is expected to continue in the current financial year also. New model cycles for smartphones will contribute to sales revenue and earnings increases in the current financial year.

Overall Assessment of Future Business Development

The business development of the Hönle Group is influenced by the economic development of the global economy.

In addition to other factors, the efficiency of the measures already implemented at Raesch Group is of vital importance to the Hönle Group's future earnings power.

Given unchanged general economic conditions and positive business development at Raesch Quarz (Germany) GmbH in the second half of the year, the Management Board expects that sales of between € 85 million and € 95 million and an operating result of between € 12 million and € 14 million will be achieved in financial year 2014/2015.

With its three business segments, Equipment & System, Glass & Lamps and Adhesives, the Hönle Group is very well positioned to manage future development. Moreover, the corporate group is represented in markets which provide strong potential for further growth. In addition to strictly organic growth, corporate acquisitions will be of importance for the expansion of the Hönle Group's business activities. Hönle intends to further strengthen its market position in the adhesives market, in particular.

Explanatory Notes

to the 3-Month Report 2014/2015

Hönle prepares interim consolidated financial statements in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) published by the International Financial Reporting Standards Board (IASB) and their interpretations as adopted in the European Union. Hönle prepares and publishes the interim consolidated financial statements in euro currency (EUR).

The present interim consolidated financial statements were prepared in accordance with IAS 34 "Interim Financial Reporting". They are to be read in the context of the consolidated financial statements published by the Company for the 2013/2014 financial year.

The consolidated balance sheet (statement of financial position) as at 31 December 2014 and the consolidated income statement, the consolidated total comprehensive income, the statement of changes in consolidated equity, and the consolidated statement of cash flows for the reporting periods ending on 31 December 2014 and 2013, respectively, as well as the notes to the financial statements were not audited and were not subjected to an audit review.

The significant accounting, valuation and consolidation methods have not changed in comparison with the 2013/2014 consolidated financial statements.
